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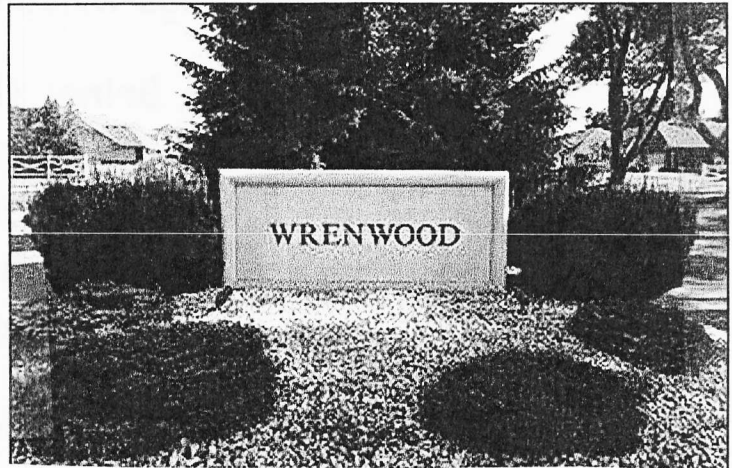
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## The President's Corner

We wanted to get an extra newsletter out to residents to hit on a few items of importance before the summer is gone.

The first item is the **WRENWOOD HOMEOWNER'S ASSOCIATION BLOCK PARTY** that is scheduled for **Saturday, July 28th from 4:00 to 8:00 PM.** A copy of the flier prepared and passed out previously by the event planners is attached for you to RSVP. The second item relates to landscaping. 4. The speed limit within Wrenwood is **25 miles per hour**. There are no exceptions on any of the streets. Please slow down and remember, there are many of us who walk around the neighborhood and exercise our pets and, most importantly, have children riding bikes and playing games.
